# And Then There Were None By Agatha Christie

Directed by Tina Hodge Thronson



Considered one of the best murder mysteries ever written, *And Then There Were None* is based on Agatha Christie's best-selling novel. Ten strangers, apparently with little in common, are lured to an island mansion by a mysterious couple. Over dinner, a record begins to play, and the voice of an unseen host accuses each person of hiding a guilty secret. That evening, one of the guests is found murdered by a deadly dose of cyanide. The tension escalates as the survivors realize the killer is not only among them but is preparing to strike again... and again... and again.

#### **Providence Players of Fairfax is:**

- A non-profit community theater troupe. All participation is on a volunteer basis. No members of the cast or crew are compensated.
- A membership organization. Membership is not required to audition. If cast, all actors (and in fact, all volunteers), are required to become members of Providence Players of Fairfax (\$25 per individual or \$60 per family three or more) for the season (if not already a member).

### **Casting Announcement**

Providence Players is casting eleven (11) roles. The original cast had eight men and three women (8m/3w). However, we are considering altering the gender of some characters which <u>could</u> mean a cast of as many as 6 women (6w). No roles are precast, and all roles are open. British accents are not required. All backgrounds, ages, ethnicities welcome and encouraged to audition!

#### **Thumbnail Character Descriptions**

ROLE	GENDER	<b>DESCRIPTIONS</b> (ages are flexible)
NARRACOTT	m	The Boatman, Age: n/a
ROGERS	m/f	The Butler: Age: 40s– 50s, Competent servant, more than a butler, a bit of a snob. Some describe him as shifty.
MRS. ROGERS	f	The Cook: Age: 30s-40s, Nervous, she appears overwhelmed and frightened.
VERA CLAYTHORNE	f	The Secretary: Age: 20s, Attractive young woman in her first job as a secretary (was a school teacher), outwardly charming but hiding significant anxiety.
PHILIP LOMBARD	m	The Soldier of Fortune: 30s-40s, Charming, cunning, a bit of a rogue, former military and mercenary.
MR/MISS MARSTON	m/f	The Rich Kid: 20's – 30's, Very attractive, spoiled and frivolous, a maniac behind the wheel.
WILLIAM BLORE	m	The Cop: Age: 40s– 50s, Retired L.A. cop, out of his element when posing as a rich businessman, but tough and competent.
GENERAL MACKENZIE	m	The General: Age: 60s, military bearing but quiet and reserved. He is wrestling with his demons and losing.
MISS EMILY BRENT	f	The Bigot: 40's – 60's, Snobbish, opinionated and self-righteous, she has just enough charm to keep all the others from killing her themselves.
JUDGE WARGRAVE	m	The Judge: Age: 60s, Famous, or infamous, law and order "hanging judge", used to being in charge, retired and now ailing.
DR. ARMSTRONG	m/f	The Doctor: 40's – 50's MD successful at treating wealthy ladies experiencing emotional problems. He was once a successful surgeon.

#### From the director, Tina Thronson

In contrast to most productions of this play, I would like to set it in the early 1940's off the coast of California. The change of venue will give the play a little California sunshine before the gloom sets in. It has the added advantage of opening up the casting to folks of different ethnicities while eliminating the challenge of British accents of different classes, unless you are a Brit – in which case you are still welcome to audition!

In spite of my light-hearted comments – this is a drama. The acting challenge will be to take the thumbnail descriptions of the characters, with their quirks and their secrets, and flesh them out into distinct individuals who evolve (yes, at breakneck speed) during the course of the play. It will be my job to help get you there.

REHEARSALS: Download a copy of the Theater Access Schedule for this show. This is NOT the specific rehearsal schedule (which will be supplied by Tina), but it will give you an idea for the commitment you are making – rehearsal space and performance – and how to identify conflicts.

A tentative rehearsal schedule will be available at auditions. The schedule will be finalized the week after casting and will be based on crew and actor conflicts. Unless indicated otherwise, all rehearsals will take place at the James Lee Community Center. Weeknight rehearsals will start at 7pm and will generally go until 9:45pm. Weekend rehearsals will be based on availability.

### Additional Audition Information/Instructions:

- **HOW WE WORK**: You are welcome to come to audition on more than one of the open audition evenings. This is not a requirement. Most Providence auditions have actors up and down to read multiple times in multiple combinations and scenes. Most actors find this fun. As space allows, you will be able to watch the auditions. You may be asked to go into the hallway with audition partners and work a bit on a scene. We will do our best to get you up multiple times reading for parts you are interested in. You will also be asked to read for other parts you may not be auditioning for. The Providence Players strives to make our productions open to interested and engaged actors & actresses, regardless of their level of experience. We try and make our auditions as relaxing and fun as possible.
- **AUDITION PROCESS & SIDES**: Auditions will consist of readings from the script. No monologue required although one of the sides may be a monologue from the play. Sides for the audition process will be supplied at auditions.

• **AUDITION FORM**: Please ALSO COMPLETE the attached Providence Audition Form and bring it with you to the audition. Resumes and headshots will be accepted, but are not required. We may ask to take a picture of you, but this is for internal use only and will not be shared.
